<u>21.6(d)</u>	Asbestos materials	Employees required to wear protective equipment as part of the necessary safeguards required by the appropriate OHS authority for the use of materials containing asbestos or to work in close proximity to employees using such materials – this allowance is paid per hour whilst the employee is wearing, or near someone wearing, the equipment	4.00%	\$0.95	Hourly
<u>21.6(e)</u>	Bitumen work	Employees handling hot bitumen, asphalt or dipping materials in creosote	4.00%	\$0.95	Hourly
<u>21.6(f)(i)</u>	Cold work	Employees who work in a place where the temperature is lowered by artificial means to less than 0° Celsius – employees receive a 20 minute paid break after every 2 hours of work, not including the special rate provided by this clause	3.20%	\$0.76	Hourly
<u>21.6(g)</u>	Cutting tiles	Employees engaged in cutting tiles by electric saw	4.00%	\$0.95	Hourly

<u>21.6(j)(ii)</u>	Hospitals and morgues	Employees engaged in repairs, demolition and/or maintenance in any block or portion of a hospital used for the care or treatment of patients suffering from infectious or contagious diseases OR an employee working inside a morgue in which one or more dead bodies are not in refrigeration – note that an employee must not receive less than 2.2% of the hourly standard rate per day (that is, 2.2% x \$22.50 = \$0.50 per day)	0.30%	\$0.52	Daily

		Employees using toxic substances of materials of a like nature	4.50%	\$1.07	Hourly
		Employees working in close proximity to the above employees	3.20%	\$0.76	Hourly
